Have you caught sock fever? Share the bug with other like-minded knitters at our new sock knitalong! On the last Friday of every month, Stephanie Engle and Christina Peters will lead us through a different sock design. Come to our kick off meeting on Friday, March 30th at 6:00pm to get started. The club is free, we only ask that you purchase materials at the shop.

Sure, we all love knitting with woolies ... but a steady diet of anything can get a little dull. Why not spice up your stitching with a bright cotton cardigan or a brilliant wrap in **Tartelette** ribbon? The spring yarns have arrived, and they're beautiful!

New from **Louisa Harding**, **Mariposa** combines a shimmery strand of viscose with mercerized cotton in an elegant yarn that would be perfect for a sophisticated spring top. **Cinnabar** has a more casual, linen-influenced look. Look closely, however, and you'll see it has the tiniest strand of bling twisted in with those natural fibers. Nothing too in your face, just a little glimmer. Its crisp finish is especially well-suited to lace patternwork.

We've added several fabulous yarns made from non-traditional and/or earth-friendly fibers. If you're looking for soft and huggable, reach for **Classic Elite's Premiere**.

This creamy blend of pima cotton and tencel comes in a delicious range of rainbow sherbet colors. Pima is a special grade of cotton renowned for its long, soft fibers and tencel comes from wood pulp (really!). We've also added **Bam Boo**, a silky soft yarn made from 100% bamboo fiber that has a brilliance and drape similar to rayon.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Time Cotton** is an eight-ply cotton/acrylic blend that's spun from the mountains of unused scraps and trimmings created by the apparel and textile industry. Available in a range of heathered shades, this worsted weight yarn comes in a generous 180 yard

skein and depicts stitchwork beautifully. For an extensive review of **2<sup>nd</sup> Time Cotton**, check out Clara Parkes comments at [knittersreview.com](http://knittersreview.com).

**Rowan's Summer Tweed** has always been a Knitting Bee favorite, but we're especially excited about this season's expanded color range and fabulous new design book, *The Kasbah Collection*. **Summer Tweed** is a satisfying blend of crunchy silk and cotton, a true delight to work with, and fabulous for colorwork. I'm almost finished with a cardigan in this yarn, and I love it!

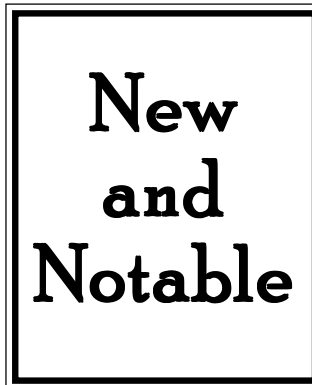
Can't find your dream colorway in sock yarn? Pick up **Louet's Hand Dyeing Kits** and color your own!

Have you noticed we now have a small but unique selection of **BUTTONS**? Some are vintage from the 30s, some are horn, some are pewter ... One thing is for sure, these

buttons are unlike anything you'll find at the craft store.

We've received a small quantity of **Lantern Moon's Ebony Destiny** circular needles. I absolutely adore these circs. The finish is amazing, and they really are a joy to knit with.

Keep an eye out for a new hand-dyed superwash merino top from **Lorna's Laces**, heavenly Australian super fine merino from **Pear Tree**, **Northern Lights** brights from **Louet** and more.


I love a good pattern book any day, but **No Sheep For You** will have a place on my shelf as a fascinating resource for all fibers “sans” sheep. Amy Singer (yes, the beloved founder of *knitty.com*) discovered at a young age that she is allergic to wool. In order to enable her need to knit, Ms. Singer has been driven to seek out and use the ever-expanding variety of non-wool fibers available to knitters today, including cotton, linen, hemp, silk, bamboo, soy, tencel and others. In the first 30 pages of **NSFY** we profit from Ms. Singer's education as we learn about the properties and uses of each of these fibers and how and when we can substitute them in patterns written for wool. (You, too, can regale your husband during commercials with your knowledge of the difference between industrial hemp and, um, hemp ... and why we can only get hemp to knit from Canada!) Next, we're treated to 20 fun patterns for sweaters, bags, socks, lacework shawls and more. **No Sheep For You** is the perfect book to help us celebrate spring knitting with all of the yummy non-wool yarns arriving at Knitting Bee.

**Favorite Socks: 25 Timeless Designs from Interweave** combines enough old and new designs to keep any sock knitter happy for many a heel and toe. This comprehensive collection includes 19 patterns originally published in Interweave magazines and six new patterns. Sock superstar Nancy Bush and Ann Budd have designed the

lion's share of patterns printed here, but you'll also find favorites from Evelyn Clark, Priscilla Gibson Roberts and numerous others. The socks range from lacey feminine styles to ethnic colorwork patterns to an intriguing boot sock that is designed to have the sole easily replaced as needed! If you love socks, this book is a must-have addition to your knitting library.

**Lace Style** is the third book in the popular “style” series put out by Interweave Press. While lace knitting has been with us for centuries, it seems that a love of lace has recently been revived. Instead of the expected collection of shawls, however, this book shows how lace can be incorporated into fashionable, wearable garments including sweaters, shrugs, skirts and even jewelry. Several shop staffers are already eyeing the Louet Gems color palette for the *Katherine Hepburn Cardigan*. I think the *Lacy Waves Top*

is one of Norah Gaughan's most accessible patterns for those of us drawn to her appealing designs but sometimes intimidated by her geometric work. There are a couple of quick shrug patterns that I fully expect to see on many of you in the months to come. Last, but not least, one of my favorite features of the **Style** series is the design notebook in the back of the book. This section encourages the adventurous and holds the hand of the timid knitter in exploring their own ideas for design, and helps us understand the mysteries of lace. Let the yarnovers begin!

**Big Baby Blankie**

*Designed by Tanya Patterson*

This cuddly blankie knits up quickly with bulky yarn and big needles.  
Use **GGH's *Big Baby*** for waves of machine-washable color.

**Materials:**

**GGH *Big Baby*** (50 g/49 yds) – 5 (7) balls  
US size #15 – 24-36" circular knitting needles

**Size:** 20" x 30" - shop model (25" x 30" - larger size)

**Gauge:** Approx. 2 st/1"

**Directions:**

Cast on 53(65) sts.

Row 1: \*K1, YO, K4, K2tog, sl 1, K1, pssso, K4, YO; repeat from \* to last st, K1.

Row 2: Purl.

Repeat these two rows until you reach desired length, leaving enough yarn to bind off. Bind off & weave in ends.
