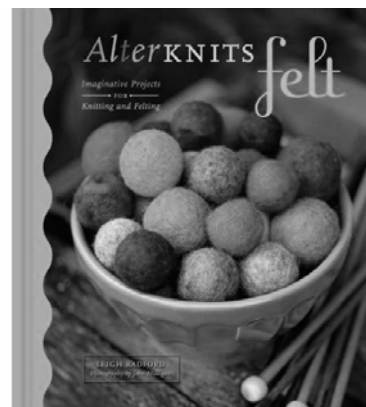

For a big dose of dreamy knitting inspiration, don't miss the 30th Anniversary issue of **Rowan Magazine**. We decided we couldn't do without ultra cuddly *Cocoon*, and we've fallen head over heels for Kaffe Fassett's new self-striping *Colourscape Chunky*. The new accompanying pattern booklets for these yarns are gorgeous, pure Rowan goodness.

The new design team at Berroco continues to shine, introducing several top quality, reasonably priced yarns. *Inca Gold* is a luxurious blend of 80% merino wool and 20% silk. Based on the shop model, even wool-sensitive staffer Kelsey has declared *Inca Gold* next-to-the-skin wearable! If you're a fan of *Ultra Alpaca*, you'll love *Cuzco*. It has the same great blend of alpaca and merino, but in a chunkier weight with a wonderful twist. (The Cosima cardigan from Berroco #281 in *Cuzco* is high up on my winter knit list.) Also look for extra fine *Pure Merino DK* and *Sox*, a brilliantly self-patterning superwash that's ideal for colorful gloves, kid's stuff, and (of course) socks.

On the subject of socks, eco-friendly *Trekking Pro Natura* combines superwash wool with actual bamboo fiber (not pulp) for a strong yarn in a great

range of heathery solids – perfect for showing off fancy stitchwork. The color gurus at **Noro** have graced us with *Silk Garden Sock*, and boy is it ever gorgeous ... but socks? In my humble opinion, this yarn is destined for lacy scarves and wraps. Combine it with a little *Kidsilk Haze* for something truly amazing!

Declaring green the new black, Lorna's Laces introduces *Green Line* – a 100% certified organic merino wool. Soft, smooth and subtly hand-dyed, *Green Line* is a pleasure to knit and the perfect weight for cozy hats and mitts.

Smitten customers were nabbing **Debbie Bliss's Donegal Chunky** and *Donegal Luxury Tweed* straight out of the boxes. What will happen when her new magazine arrives?!

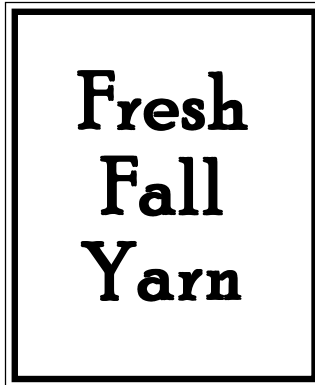
Our infatuation with **Classic Elite** continues unabated. Booklets *Autumn 1 & 2* and *Alpaca Stories* feature one great design after another, many knit in the round.

I'm currently working on

a topdown pullover out of dreamy *Miracle*, a single-ply blend of drapery alpaca and tencel. Yummy!

And to save the best for last, we're expecting our first shipment of sumptuously handpainted *Wasonga* from **Curious Creek Fibers** to arrive very soon. Springy and soft, sturdy and strong, *Wasonga* merino wool is perfect for colorwork, lace, socks or baby. This yarn will have very limited availability in the Portland market ... come see why we just had to have it!

Free Pattern!

Big Button Hat

This adorable hat features a wide garter stitch brim accented with a sassy, oversized button. One skein of self-stripping **Colourscape Chunky** will make two hats – one for you, one for a friend!

Materials:

1 skein *Rowan Colourscape Chunky*

US size #10.5-10.75 - 16" circular and double pointed needles

One large button

Gauge: 3.5 st = 1" in stockinette stitch

Size: Adult, one size fits most. Approx. 21" around.

Directions:

Cast on 84 stitches with circular needles.

Do not join (the band is worked flat).

Knit 14 rows (you should count 7 garter stitch "ridges" on the RS).

On the next WS row, bind off 11 sts. Knit remaining sts to end of row.

Turn. Knit RS row to last st.

Join for working in the round as follows: Knit the last stitch of previous row together with the first stitch in the new round (K2tog).

Place marker. Knit until work measures approx 6" to bottom edge.

Begin decreasing as follows.

(After several decrease rounds you will need to switch to double point needles.)

Round 1: * K7, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 2: * K6, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 3: * K5, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 4: * K4, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 5: * K3, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 6: * K2, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 7: * K1, K2tog, repeat from *

Round 8 & 9: K2tog all the way around.



Finishing:

With darning needle, thread tail through remaining stitches and draw tail up tight. Run the yarn through hole at top and weave in ends. Attach button where band of hat overlaps, securing both layers.
